

Triángulo Rosa / Pink Triangle

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Triángulo Rosa [Pink Triangle] is a project drafted as a space for reflection and action around LGBTIQ+ activism in schools and interpellates its main agents (childhood, adolescence, families, teachers, educational institutions) looking for a confluence of strategies and articulating an active response to the reactionary wave of the present times.

After three Triángulo Rosa meetings, we invited activist and sociologist Miguel Missé and the teacher and pedagogue Mercedes Sánchez Sáinz to engage a conversation focused on the situation of diverse sex-generic expressions at school and on the analysis of the structures of violence that underlie (and often emerge) in school institutions. The debate is joined by participants in the meetings (students, teachers, families).

This debate is part of THE CONSTITUENT MUSEUM IN DIALOGUE, a series of
